We learnt with great pleasure that on next November 15 should be performed the launching ceremony of the German website *Sonnentaler*, inspired from the *La main à la pâte*'s website, and jointly supported and developed by the *Freie Universität* of Berlin and the *Berlin-Brandenburgischen Akademie der Wissenschaften*.

Your initiative has became part of a international network of "mirror" websites for science education sharing the same commitment in favour of a deep renewal of the way science is taught at primary school: in China, in Egypt, in Serbia, in many Latino-American countries and possibly soon in Iran, contents and functionalities adapted from the *La main à la pâte*'s website have been largely shared in the past few years.
